Rev. Fr. Mahendra Gunatilleke was ordained into the priesthood on 25th July 1992 for the Arch Diocese of Colombo.

During his Priesthood, he served at many Parishes and was also the director/ editor of Messenger at the Catholic Press in Colombo

At the plenary meeting held by the Catholic Bishop's Conference on 4 May 2017, Rev. Fr Mahendra Gunatilleke was appointed as the new National Director for the Catholic National Commission for Justice, Peace and Human Development, Caritas Sri Lanka - SEDEC.

During his tenure of service in the organization, he adopted and implemented many new strategies pertaining to the development of the organization and execution of the programs and for the welfare of the organization.

Political instability & Economic Crisis

During the economic and political crisis, Rev. Fr. Mahendra Gunatilleke, introduce the DRR Plan under the caption "Enhancing Resilience of the Victims of the Economic Crisis in Sri Lanka" where an "Emergency Appeal" was submitted to Caritas Internationalis (CI) in order to request pledges and commitments to support the vulnerable and neediest citizens of our motherland.

Completion of the New Building

After the takeover of Caritas Sri Lanka by Rev. Fr. Mahendra Gunatilleke, he spearheaded the construction of a seven-story building. It was declared opened on 18th March 2021, under the patronage of His Lordship Rt. Rev. Dr. Winston Fernando, Charmin, CBCSL, Rt. Rev. Dr. Justin Gnapragasam, Chairman, CSL Rt. Rev. Dr. Maxwell Silva, Vice Chairman, CSL and the Diocesan Directors of the Caritas Network.



Incoming National Director Fr. Luke Nelson



The Catholic Bishops' Conference of Sri Lanka appointed Rev. Fr. Luke Nelson as the new National Director on 9 June 2022. He is a senior priest from the Diocese of Chilaw with years of experience in the administrative and management sphere, especially within the church circle.

Rev. Fr. Jayasooriya Kuranage Luke Nelson Gamini Perera born to J.K. Moses Perera and V.W Leegiya Fernando on 14th December 1964, is the eldest son of a family consisting of four brothers and a sister.

He received his primary education from the St Joseph Vass College, Wennapuwa, and later, he joined the St Paul's Minor Seminary at Marawila where he completed his secondary education attending St Xavier's College, Marawila.

His higher education was completed at the National Seminary of Our Lady of Lanka, Ampitiaya, and was ordained a priest on 20th July 1991 at Mother of Sorrow's Church Nanimadama.

Fr Luke Nelson had been working as the assistant parish priest in St. Anne's National Shrine, Thalawila from 1991-1992, Nattandiya - 1992, Borelessa -1993. Then he served as the Vice-Rector at the St. Paul's Minor Seminary in 1994 and then was appointed as the parish priest of St. Mary's Cathedral in 1995.

He was the parish priest at St. Anthony's Shrine, Kottapitiya and served as the Administrator at St. Anne's National Shrine, Thalawila.

He also served as the Diocesan Director of Lakrivi and Holy Childhood Societies. He was once the Bursar of National Seminary Ampitiya, and later became the Procurator General in the Diocese of Chilaw.

In 2019, he was appointed as the Director of Caritas Chilaw - Janasaviya, SEDEC.

He was also the National Director for the National Catholic Commission for Interreligious Dialogue and Ecumenism in 2021.
